Bringing the harvest and the questions home

In September 2010 the traveling exhibition **EXAMPLES TO FOLLOW!** started in the Uferhallen. ETF! has pioneered a different artistic practice in terms of size, internationality, and breadth of artistic approaches, as well as in the gender balance; out of by now 139 artists 46 % are female!

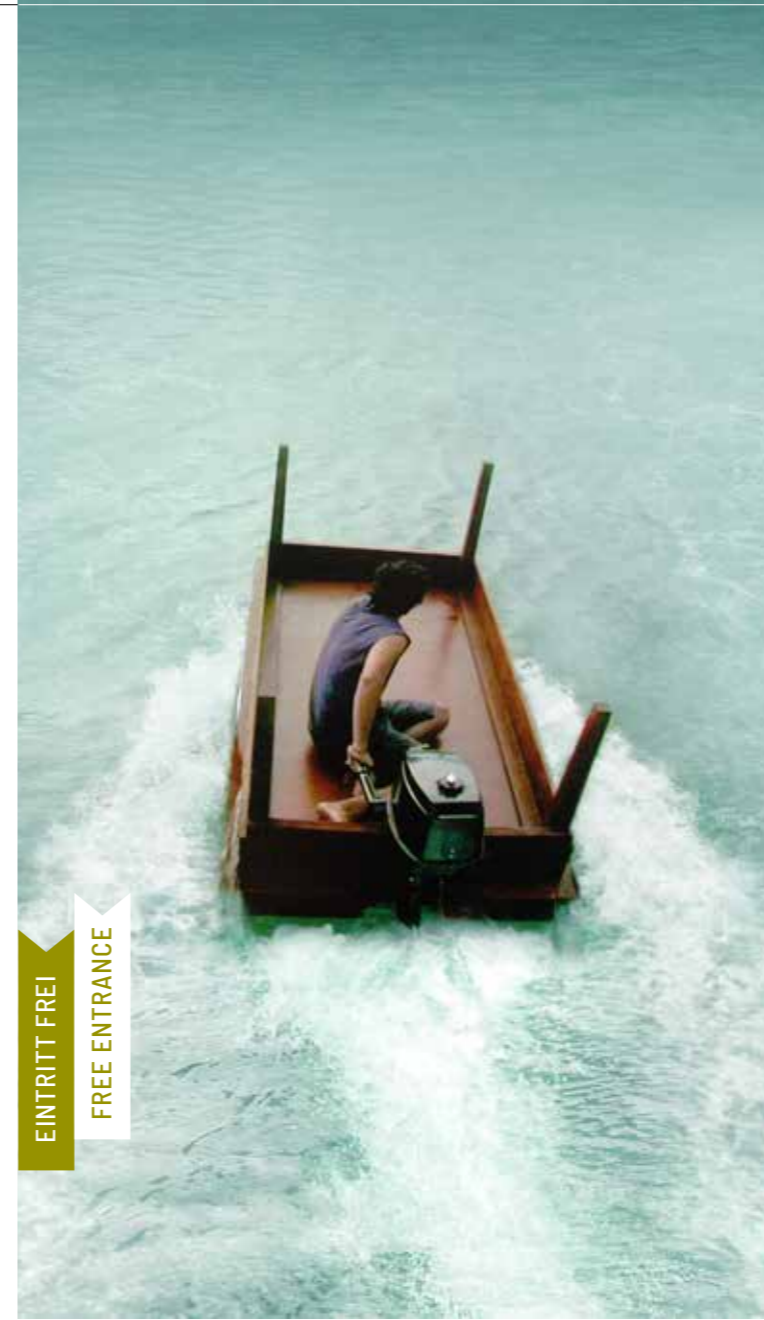
In our 13th year, we return to this first stop for the 20th edition enriched by the expertise of international artists and scientists. The topics addressed by the **81 artistic positions** have rapidly gained urgency in recent years, as has the call for interdisciplinary collaboration. The central questions of ETF! about the connection between art, science, social and political activism are more pressing than ever before.

In 2010 we were at the very forefront of sustainable thinking, as from the very beginning, our concept envisioned to resist the global greed forever new artistic works.

That is why I only selected already existing artworks dealing with regional and environmental topics and combating the human hybrid of the Anthropocene. **128 artists and boundary pushers from 29 countries** have contributed to the ever growing knowledge. With each new venue, the presentation changed and condensed anew by integrating local expertise. At a total of **29 exhibition sites** on four continents, we initiated **700 conversations** between art, science, the nonprofit business and politics.

Out of this rich well of the last 12 years we present 70 artworks, insights and open questions. 11 new works have been added, dealing with the colonial history of nutmeg, rubber, the Amazon and the devastation of the Anthropocene. **In workshops we will counteract the catastrophic contribution of the conventional construction industry to the climate disaster.**

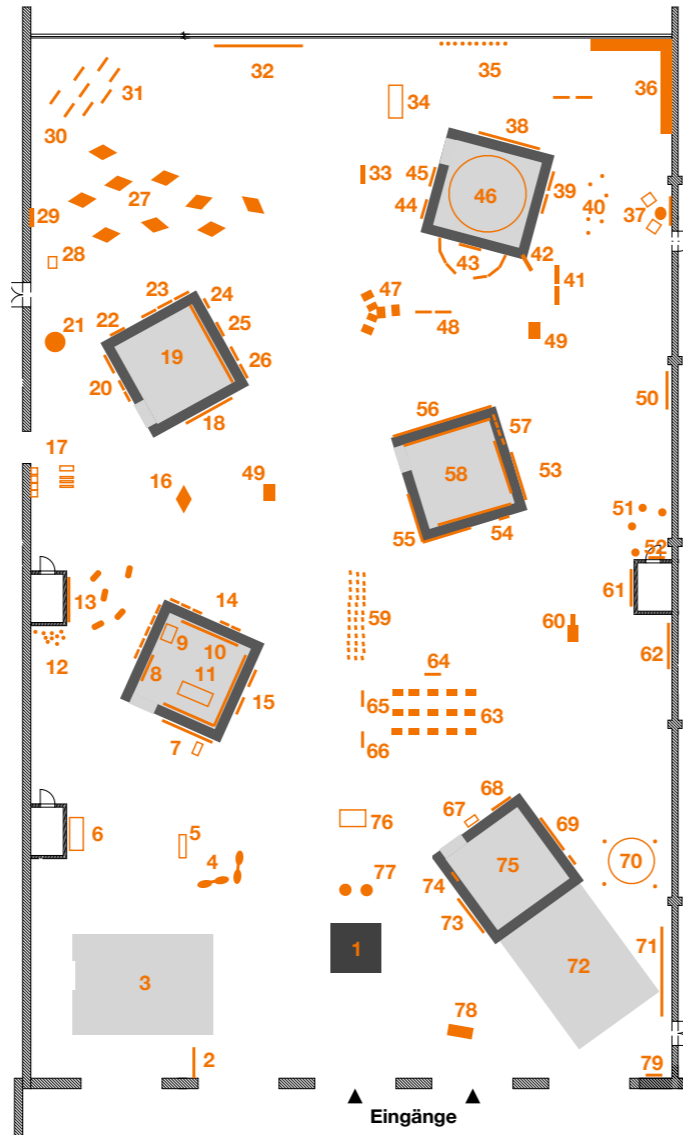
